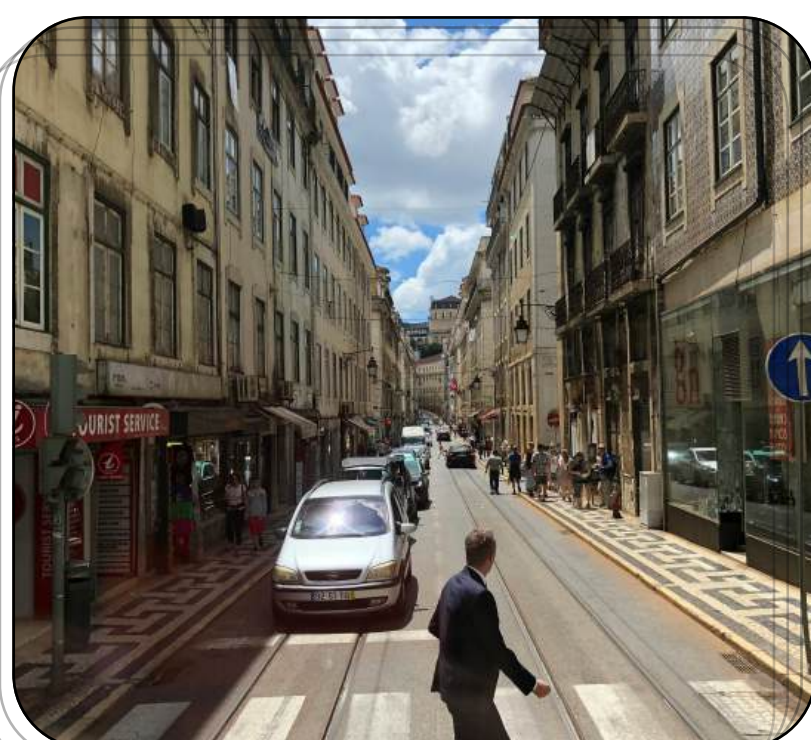


Key Facts About Pedestrian Accidents
