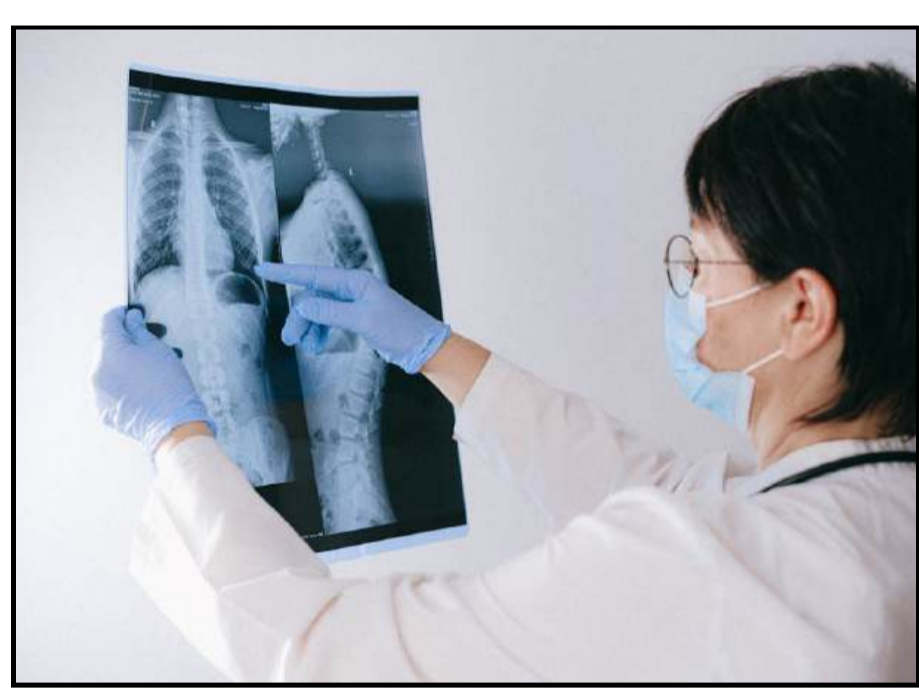


### 2. Fear of Legal Costs
