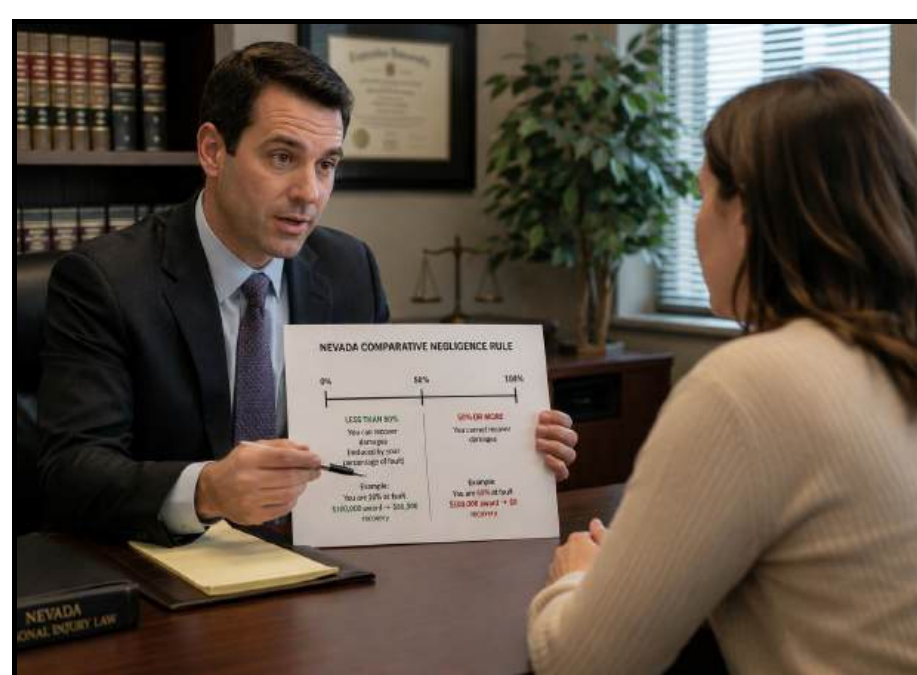
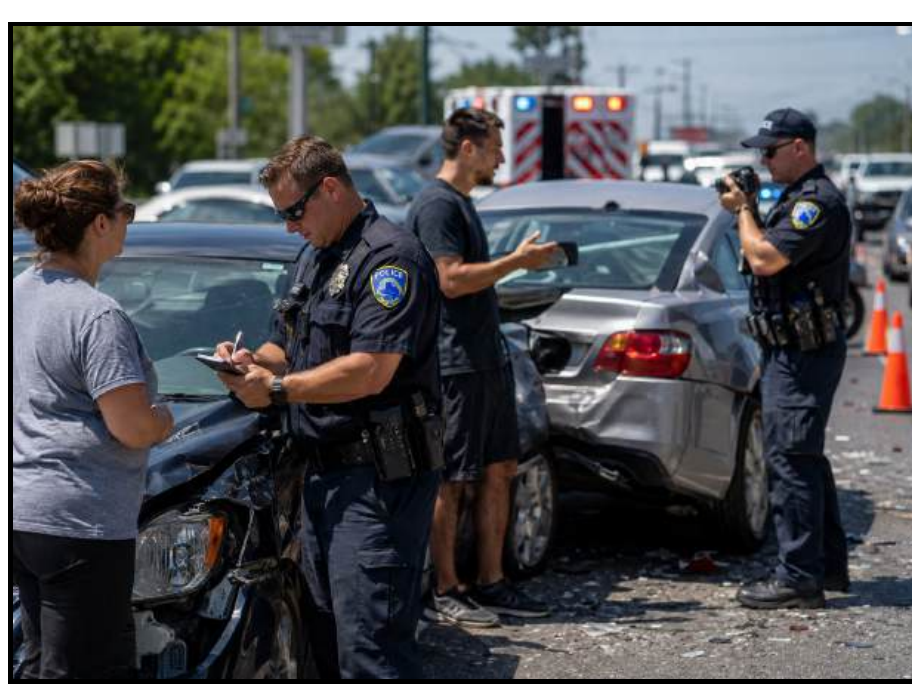


2. Common Injuries From Multi-Car Accidents

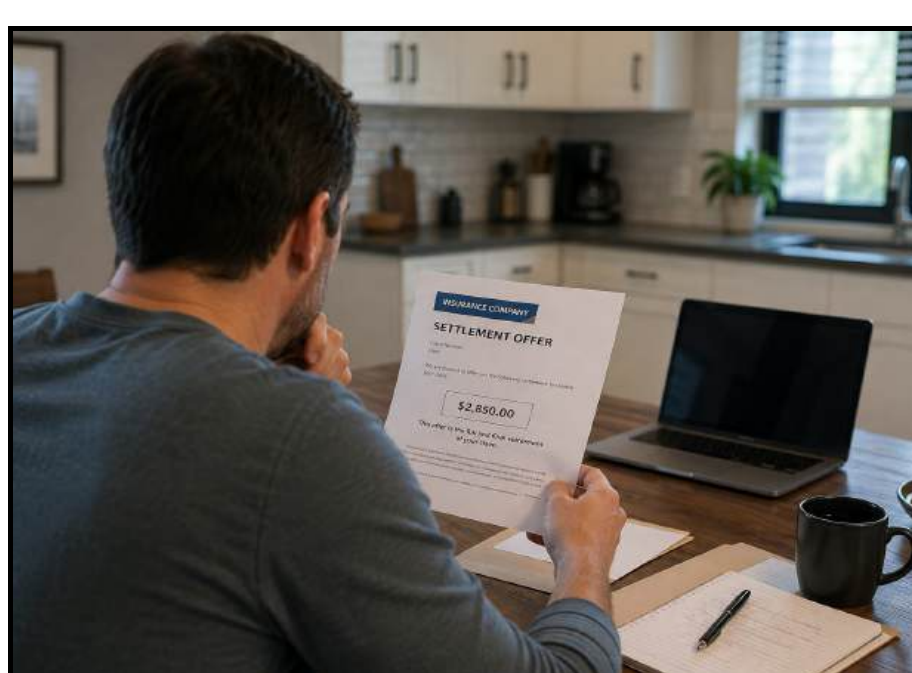


4. What If You're Partially at Fault?

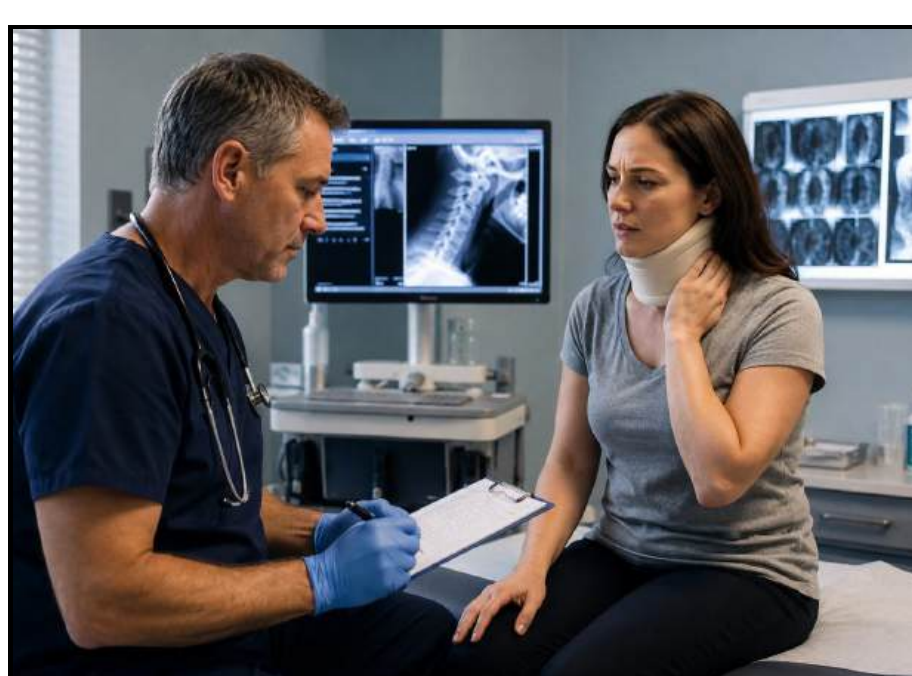


6. What to Do After an Accident
